# No mending at mine meeting

**The controversy surrounding the Fingerboards Mineral Sands mine at Glenaladale continued at Kalbar Resources' information night on Wednesday at the Lindenow Hall.**

A large crowd attended the session with Carolyn Balint, of Coffey, a specialist in geotechnical and environmental project management services, and Dr Rob Loch, of Landloch, a group of soil and environmental scientists and engineers, addressing the crowd about four key assessments; groundwater and surface water baseline and impact, rehabilitation, human health risk and socioeconomic impact.

The latter topic wasn't discussed due to the session running late into the night as many members of the community voiced their concerns about the proposed mine.

In what could have been seen as an opportunity for Kalbar Resources and the community to bridge a gap in the relationship was quickly dismissed with the anti-mining people interrupting presentations. Kalbar's information evening which was to include a question and answer quickly session, turned into a back and fourth debate with community members disagreeing with the facts and findings being presented.
